Erik Erikson's theory of the stages of human development. Developmental psychologist Erik H. Erikson (1902-1994) was best known for his theory on social development of human beings, and for coining the phrase identity crisis. The theory describes eight stages through which a healthily

Erikson's stages of psychosocial development, as articulated in the second half of the 20th century by Erik Erikson in collaboration with Joan Erikson, is a comprehensive psychoanalytic theory that identifies a series of eight stages that a healthy developing individual should pass through from infancy to late adulthood. Erikson's stage theory characterizes an individual advancing through the eight life stages as a function of negotiating their biological and sociocultural forces. Each stage is
